ORDINANCE TO REPEAL AND RECREATE AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE USE OF FIREARMS WITHIN THE TOWN OF LEROY

The Town Board of Supervisors of the Town of Leroy, Dodge County, Wisconsin, does hereby ordain as follows:

Town Ordinance No. 10, entitled "An Ordinance to Repeal and Recreate an Ordinance Heretofore Adopted to Regulate to the Use of Firearms Within the Town of Leroy," adopted on April 14, 1975 is hereby repealed and recreated to provide as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. **Purpose and Authority**. The Town adopts this Ordinance pursuant to its duly adopted village powers under Wis. Stat., sec. 61.34 for the government and good order of the Town, for its commercial benefit and for the health, safety, welfare and convenience of the public.

<u>Section 2</u>. **Definition**. For the purpose of this Ordinance, the term "firearm" shall mean any weapon that acts by force of gunpowder.

<u>Section 3</u>. **Prohibited Acts**. No person shall discharge a firearm in any of the following areas:

- (a) The area commonly known as the "unincorporated Village of Leroy."
 - (b) Within the boundaries of the Leroy Sanitary District.
 - (c) Within 500 feet of St. Andrews Church, located at W3081 County Road Y, Lomira, Wisconsin.
 - (d) Within 500 feet of any residence in the Town of Leroy.
 - (e) Within 500 feet of any public building, public park or public enclosure in the Town of Leroy.
 - (f) Within 500 feet of any public highway, road, street or alley in the Town of Leroy.

<u>Section 4</u>. **Enforcement**. Any person who violates any provision of this Ordinance shall be subject to a forfeiture of \$25 for the first violation and a forfeiture of not less than \$30 nor more than \$100 for each subsequent violation. The Town also reserves the right to other remedies, including but not limited to injunctive relief.

<u>Section 5</u>. **Severability**. Should any word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or portion of this Ordinance be declared invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole, but shall only affect the portion thereof declared to be invalid.
